# SCENARIO AND PROBLEM-SOLVING QUESTIONS

RESPONDING TO THESE QUESTIONS INVOLVES DEMONSTRATING CRITICAL THINKING, PRIORITIZATION, AND TEAMWORK SKILLS.

CANDIDATES SHOULD CLEARLY ARTICULATE THEIR THOUGHT PROCESSES, REFERENCING PROTOCOLS SUCH AS ACLS

ALGORITHMS AND INFECTION CONTROL MEASURES.

# BEHAVIORAL AND SITUATIONAL INTERVIEW QUESTIONS

Behavioral questions explore interpersonal skills, teamwork, and stress management—attributes essential in critical care settings. These questions reveal how candidates handle challenges and communicate with colleagues and patients' families.

- DESCRIBE HOW YOU HANDLE CONFLICTS WITHIN YOUR HEALTHCARE TEAM.

Providing structured answers using the STAR method (Situation, Task, Action, Result) can effectively convey professionalism and communication skills critical in the ICU environment.
