- **:nth-child(n)** - Selects elements based on their position among siblings.
- **:active** - Styles an element during activation (e.g., button press).

Pseudo-elements

Pseudo-elements target parts of elements, such as the first letter or before/after content insertion:

- **::before** - Inserts content before an element's content.

- **::after** - Inserts content after an element's content.
- **::first-letter** - Styles the first letter of a text block.
- **::first-line** - Styles the first line of text.

Transitions and Animations
