## SCHOLARSHIP: ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE

TO QUALIFY FOR NHS MEMBERSHIP, STUDENTS MUST DEMONSTRATE A STRONG COMMITMENT TO LEARNING AND MAINTAIN A HIGH GRADE POINT AVERAGE, TYPICALLY ABOVE A 3.0 ON A 4.0 SCALE. THIS PILLAR REFLECTS THE VALUE PLACED ON INTELLECTUAL GROWTH, DISCIPLINE, AND THE PURSUIT OF KNOWLEDGE.

## MAINTAINING HIGH ACADEMIC STANDARDS

ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE REQUIRES CONSISTENT EFFORT, EFFECTIVE STUDY HABITS, AND A GENUINE INTEREST IN LEARNING. NHS MEMBERS ARE EXPECTED TO CHALLENGE THEMSELVES WITH RIGOROUS COURSEWORK, SUCH AS ADVANCED PLACEMENT (AP) OR HONORS CLASSES, TO DEEPEN THEIR UNDERSTANDING AND PREPARE FOR FUTURE EDUCATIONAL ENDEAVORS.

## ROLE OF SCHOLARSHIP IN NHS MEMBERSHIP

## HOW CAN STUDENTS DEMONSTRATE LEADERSHIP FOR NHS CONSIDERATION?
