escaped Nazi Germany as children—some had come to America with their parents, others had escaped alone, but their experiences, and what they'd been forced to leave behind, meant they had personal motivation to do whatever they could to defeat Nazi Germany. They were perfect for the difficult and complex job at hand. They never used corporal punishment in interrogations of German soldiers but developed and deployed dozens of tricks to gain information. The Allies won the war against Hitler for a host of reasons, discussed in hundreds of volumes. This is the first book to describe the intelligence operations at PO Box 1142 and their part in that success. It will never be known how many American lives were spared, or whether the war ended sooner with the programs at Fort Hunt, but it's doubtless that they made a difference—and gave the young Jewish men stationed there the chance to combat the evil that had befallen them and their families.
