To get your L, you should score at least 40 out of 50 questions in the multiple-choice knowledge test. That is, you must answer 80% of the questions correctly. On average, it takes 25-26 minutes to finish the test. Roughly one in five questions on your official knowledge test will cover road signs. You'll be allowed to skip each question up to two times during the exam.
