PROGRAM OVERVIEW

THE PROGRAM IS STRUCTURED TO PROVIDE RESIDENTS WITH A BROAD CLINICAL FOUNDATION IN PRIMARY CARE, EMPHASIZING PREVENTIVE MEDICINE, CHRONIC DISEASE MANAGEMENT, AND ACUTE CARE. MAYO CLINIC'S INTEGRATED HEALTHCARE SYSTEM ALLOWS RESIDENTS TO TRAIN IN A VARIETY OF CLINICAL SETTINGS, INCLUDING URBAN, SUBURBAN, AND RURAL COMMUNITIES, WHICH ENHANCES EXPOSURE TO DIVERSE PATIENT POPULATIONS. THE RESIDENCY FOSTERS A COLLABORATIVE LEARNING ENVIRONMENT THAT ENCOURAGES INTERDISCIPLINARY TEAMWORK, INNOVATION, AND EVIDENCE-BASED PRACTICE. THIS APPROACH ENSURES THAT GRADUATES ARE WELL-EQUIPPED TO MEET THE EVOLVING NEEDS OF PATIENTS AND HEALTHCARE SYSTEMS.

PROGRAM MISSION AND GOALS

THE MISSION OF THE MAYO CLINIC FAMILY MEDICINE RESIDENCY IS TO TRAIN COMPASSIONATE, COMPETENT, AND CONFIDENT FAMILY PHYSICIANS WHO PROVIDE PATIENT-CENTERED CARE. THE PROGRAM AIMS TO PREPARE RESIDENTS TO ADDRESS THE COMPLEX HEALTH ISSUES FACED BY INDIVIDUALS AND FAMILIES ACROSS ALL AGES, GENDERS, AND BACKGROUNDS. KEY GOALS INCLUDE PROMOTING LIFELONG LEARNING, LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT, AND COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT, WHILE ADVANCING THE SCIENCE OF FAMILY MEDICINE THROUGH RESEARCH AND QUALITY IMPROVEMENT INITIATIVES.

PROGRAM STRUCTURE

THE RESIDENCY TYPICALLY SPANS THREE YEARS, DURING WHICH RESIDENTS ROTATE THROUGH VARIOUS DISCIPLINES SUCH AS INTERNAL MEDICINE, PEDIATRICS, OBSTETRICS AND GYNECOLOGY, SURGERY, EMERGENCY MEDICINE, AND PSYCHIATRY. EACH ROTATION IS DESIGNED TO BUILD CORE COMPETENCIES WHILE ALLOWING RESIDENTS TO DEVELOP INDIVIDUALIZED AREAS OF INTEREST. THE PROGRAM ALSO INCORPORATES LONGITUDINAL CLINICS WHERE RESIDENTS FOLLOW THEIR OWN PANEL OF PATIENTS, FOSTERING CONTINUITY OF CARE AND A DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF PATIENT RELATIONSHIPS.

CURRICULUM AND TRAINING

THE CURRICULUM OF THE MAYO CLINIC FAMILY MEDICINE RESIDENCY INTEGRATES CLINICAL TRAINING WITH DIDACTIC EDUCATION AND RESEARCH OPPORTUNITIES. RESIDENTS RECEIVE A BALANCED EDUCATION THAT INCLUDES INPATIENT AND OUTPATIENT EXPERIENCES, PROCEDURAL SKILLS, AND EXPOSURE TO SUBSPECIALTY CARE RELEVANT TO FAMILY MEDICINE PRACTICE. THE PROGRAM EMPHASIZES EVIDENCE-BASED MEDICINE, QUALITY IMPROVEMENT, AND PATIENT SAFETY.

CLINICAL ROTATIONS

RESIDENTS PARTICIPATE IN A WIDE RANGE OF CLINICAL ROTATIONS DESIGNED TO DEVELOP VERSATILITY AND DEPTH IN FAMILY MEDICINE. CORE ROTATIONS INCLUDE:

- PRIMARY CARE CLINIC: CONTINUITY OF CARE WITH A DIVERSE PATIENT POPULATION.
- INPATIENT MEDICINE: MANAGEMENT OF ACUTE AND CHRONIC ILLNESSES IN HOSPITALIZED PATIENTS.
- PEDIATRICS: CARE OF INFANTS, CHILDREN, AND ADOLESCENTS.
- OBSTETRICS AND GYNECOLOGY: PRENATAL CARE, DELIVERIES, AND WOMEN'S HEALTH SERVICES.
- EMERGENCY MEDICINE: ACUTE CARE AND STABILIZATION OF EMERGENT CONDITIONS.
- · BEHAVIORAL HEALTH: DIAGNOSIS AND MANAGEMENT OF MENTAL HEALTH DISORDERS.
- SURGERY AND PROCEDURAL SKILLS: BASIC SURGICAL PROCEDURES AND WOUND CARE.

DIDACTIC EDUCATION AND CONFERENCES

THE PROGRAM OFFERS A ROBUST SCHEDULE OF EDUCATIONAL CONFERENCES, WORKSHOPS, AND SEMINARS. RESIDENTS PARTICIPATE IN WEEKLY ACADEMIC HALF-DAYS THAT COVER CLINICAL TOPICS, ETHICS, HEALTH POLICY, AND PRACTICE MANAGEMENT. JOURNAL CLUBS AND MORBIDITY AND MORTALITY CONFERENCES ENCOURAGE CRITICAL THINKING AND CONTINUOUS IMPROVEMENT. ADDITIONALLY, SIMULATION LABS PROVIDE HANDS-ON TRAINING IN ADVANCED PROCEDURES AND EMERGENCY RESPONSE.

RESEARCH AND SCHOLARLY ACTIVITY

Scholarly activity is an integral part of the residency at Mayo Clinic. Residents are encouraged to engage in research projects, quality improvement initiatives, and community health programs. Faculty mentors guide residents in developing research questions, study design, and manuscript preparation. This emphasis on scholarship fosters a culture of inquiry and evidence-based practice that benefits both patients and the medical community.

FACULTY AND MENTORSHIP

The application process for the Mayo Clinic family medicine residency is competitive and thorough. Prospective residents must demonstrate strong academic performance, clinical aptitude, and a commitment to family medicine. The program participates in the National Resident Matching Program (NRMP) and adheres to standardized application time ines.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

APPLICANTS MUST HAVE GRADUATED FROM AN ACCREDITED MEDICAL SCHOOL, SUCCESSFULLY COMPLETED THE UNITED STATES MEDICAL LICENSING EXAMINATION (USMLE) OR COMPREHENSIVE OSTEOPATHIC MEDICAL LICENSING EXAMINATION (COMLEX), AND MEET ALL CREDENTIALING REQUIREMENTS. INTERNATIONAL MEDICAL GRADUATES MAY APPLY BUT SHOULD VERIFY SPECIFIC ELIGIBILITY AND VISA REQUIREMENTS.

INTERVIEW PROCESS

SELECTED APPLICANTS ARE INVITED FOR INTERVIEWS, WHICH PROVIDE AN OPPORTUNITY TO ASSESS FIT WITH THE PROGRAM'S CULTURE AND VALUES. INTERVIEWS MAY INCLUDE MULTIPLE FACULTY MEMBERS, CURRENT RESIDENTS, AND PROGRAM LEADERSHIP. APPLICANTS ARE EVALUATED ON CLINICAL KNOWLEDGE, COMMUNICATION SKILLS, PROFESSIONALISM, AND COMMITMENT TO FAMILY MEDICINE.
