MAYO CLINIC'S INTEGRATED HEALTHCARE SYSTEM ALLOWS RESIDENTS TO TRAIN IN A VARIETY OF CLINICAL SETTINGS, INCLUDING URBAN, SUBURBAN, AND RURAL COMMUNITIES, WHICH ENHANCES EXPOSURE TO DIVERSE PATIENT POPULATIONS. THE RESIDENCY FOSTERS A COLLABORATIVE LEARNING ENVIRONMENT THAT ENCOURAGES INTERDISCIPLINARY TEAMWORK, INNOVATION, AND EVIDENCE-BASED PRACTICE. THIS APPROACH ENSURES THAT GRADUATES ARE WELL-EQUIPPED TO MEET THE EVOLVING NEEDS OF PATIENTS AND HEALTHCARE SYSTEMS.

PROGRAM MISSION AND GOALS

THE MISSION OF THE MAYO CLINIC FAMILY MEDICINE RESIDENCY IS TO TRAIN COMPASSIONATE, COMPETENT, AND CONFIDENT FAMILY PHYSICIANS WHO PROVIDE PATIENT-CENTERED CARE. THE PROGRAM AIMS TO PREPARE RESIDENTS TO ADDRESS THE COMPLEX HEALTH ISSUES FACED BY INDIVIDUALS AND FAMILIES ACROSS ALL AGES, GENDERS, AND BACKGROUNDS. KEY GOALS INCLUDE PROMOTING LIFELONG LEARNING, LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT, AND COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT, WHILE ADVANCING THE SCIENCE OF FAMILY MEDICINE THROUGH RESEARCH AND QUALITY IMPROVEMENT INITIATIVES.

PROGRAM STRUCTURE

THE RESIDENCY TYPICALLY SPANS THREE YEARS, DURING WHICH RESIDENTS ROTATE THROUGH VARIOUS DISCIPLINES SUCH AS INTERNAL MEDICINE, PEDIATRICS, OBSTETRICS AND GYNECOLOGY, SURGERY, EMERGENCY MEDICINE, AND PSYCHIATRY. EACH ROTATION IS DESIGNED TO BUILD CORE COMPETENCIES WHILE ALLOWING RESIDENTS TO DEVELOP INDIVIDUALIZED AREAS OF INTEREST. THE PROGRAM ALSO INCORPORATES LONGITUDINAL CLINICS WHERE RESIDENTS FOLLOW THEIR OWN PANEL OF PATIENTS, FOSTERING CONTINUITY OF CARE AND A DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF PATIENT RELATIONSHIPS.

CURRICULUM AND TRAINING

THE CURRICULUM OF THE MAYO CLINIC FAMILY MEDICINE RESIDENCY INTEGRATES CLINICAL TRAINING WITH DIDACTIC EDUCATION AND RESEARCH OPPORTUNITIES. - OBSTETRICS AND GYNECOLOGY: PRENATAL CARE, DELIVERIES, AND WOMEN'S HEALTH SERVICES.
- EMERGENCY MEDICINE: ACUTE CARE AND STABILIZATION OF EMERGENT CONDITIONS.
- BEHAVIORAL HEALTH: DIAGNOSIS AND MANAGEMENT OF MENTAL HEALTH DISORDERS.
- SURGERY AND PROCEDURAL SKILLS: BASIC SURGICAL PROCEDURES AND WOUND CARE.

DIDACTIC EDUCATION AND CONFERENCES

FACULTY MENTORS GUIDE RESIDENTS IN DEVELOPING RESEARCH QUESTIONS, STUDY DESIGN, AND MANUSCRIPT PREPARATION. THIS EMPHASIS ON SCHOLARSHIP FOSTERS A CULTURE OF INQUIRY AND EVIDENCE-BASED PRACTICE THAT BENEFITS BOTH PATIENTS AND THE MEDICAL COMMUNITY.

FACULTY AND MENTORSHIP

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

APPLICANTS MUST HAVE GRADUATED FROM AN ACCREDITED MEDICAL SCHOOL, SUCCESSFULLY COMPLETED THE UNITED STATES MEDICAL LICENSING EXAMINATION (USMLE) OR COMPREHENSIVE OSTEOPATHIC MEDICAL LICENSING EXAMINATION (COMLEX), AND MEET ALL CREDENTIALING REQUIREMENTS. INTERNATIONAL MEDICAL GRADUATES MAY APPLY BUT SHOULD VERIFY SPECIFIC ELIGIBILITY AND VISA REQUIREMENTS.

- MEDICAL SCHOOL TRANSCRIPTS AND EXAMINATION SCORES

INTERVIEW PROCESS

APPLICANTS ARE EVALUATED ON CLINICAL KNOWLEDGE, COMMUNICATION SKILLS, PROFESSIONALISM, AND COMMITMENT TO FAMILY MEDICINE.

Residency program faculty are faced with many challenges, and this book gives them and others who are interested or involved in residency programs a clear and comprehensive breakdown of family medicine graduate medical education.
