Westminster systems do appear to have some robust abilities to impose losses, and US institutions provide more opportunities for loss-avoiders to

resist government policy in some sectors. But in most sectors, outcomes in the two countries are strikingly similar. The Government Taketh Away is essential for the scholar and students of public policy or comparative policy. It is also an important book for the average citizen who wants to know more about the complexities of living in a democratic society where the government can give-but how it can also, sometimes painfully, taketh away.
