Common verbs that use *être* include *aller* (to go), *venir* (to come), *arriver* (to arrive), and *partir* (to leave). The present tense conjugation of *être* is:

- Je suis
- Tu es
- Il/Elle/On est
- · Nous sommes
- Vous êtes
- Ils/Elles sont

Example: Elle est allée (She went), Ils sont arrivés (They arrived).

Forming Past Participles

The past participle is a crucial element in constructing the passé composé. It varies depending on the verb ending and whether the verb is regular or irregular. Correct formation and agreement of the past participle are vital for grammatical accuracy in the passé composé.

Regular Past Participles
