Weaknesses are internal limitations or areas where the team lacks proficiency. These might involve skill gaps, poor communication, lack of motivation, unclear roles, or insufficient resources. Recognizing weaknesses allows teams to target improvements and mitigate risks.

OPPORTUNITIES

OPPORTUNITIES ENCOMPASS EXTERNAL CONDITIONS OR TRENDS THAT THE TEAM CAN EXPLOIT TO ITS ADVANTAGE. THESE MIGHT BE MARKET TRENDS, NEW TECHNOLOGIES, PARTNERSHIPS, OR CHANGES IN ORGANIZATIONAL PRIORITIES. AWARENESS OF OPPORTUNITIES ENCOURAGES PROACTIVE PLANNING AND INNOVATION.

THREATS

THREATS ARE EXTERNAL CHALLENGES THAT COULD NEGATIVELY IMPACT THE TEAM'S SUCCESS. THESE INCLUDE COMPETITION, CHANGING REGULATIONS, RESOURCE CONSTRAINTS, OR ECONOMIC DOWNTURNS. IDENTIFYING THREATS ENABLES TEAMS TO DEVELOP CONTINGENCY PLANS AND DEFENSIVE STRATEGIES.

HOW TO CONDUCT A SWOT ANALYSIS FOR TEAM
